From a member of the Broadband Team. If you haven't heard we have a major opportunity to get Broadband in Burland Ranchettes and some surrounding areas. So, you ask Why? This info and more is on www.burlandfiber.org

- Your home will have its own DIRECT fiber line connection no need to share signal from a tower.
- Stable product with reliability no lag times during peak times
- Higher bandwidth (internet speed) FASTER INTERNET!!!!
- Stream movies, music, games, etc. with no interruptions or lag to service
- Better WIFI connection to cameras and security systems

What's the difference from what I have now? (NOTE: these are my opinions, and are not intended to give any company a poor rating. I personally have Neteo and am very happy with what I have, but would also love to have Fiber)

- If you have Rise or Neteo, you're currently "sharing" broadband internet service with all the other subscribers in our area. This can cause lags or slower speeds during **times of high usage**.
- Rise and Neteo Broadband is provided by signals from cellular towers. Much like cell-phones, when usage is overloading the tower, service begins to lag.
- CenturyLink provides service in some homes in Burland, but not all. From my understanding, the technology in our area is outdated and there is not any plans/budget to update it.
- If you are happy with your current service, that's great. **I am too.** However, if we don't move on Fiber, what you currently have may be all you will get (not much improvement unless the companies invest in our area more). With Fiber, we have the option to enhance service and keep up technological advancements.

What is required to make this happen?

- We have an opportunity to receive a grant to help offset costs for the build. While South Park Telephone will be investing a considerable amount towards the build, the grant requires commitment from interested prospects.
- For best chance of success at getting grant, South Park Telephone suggested 50% commitment from Burland Homeowners (approx. 500-600 homes account for 50% of Burland)
- This commitment requires a \$500 one-time fee.
 - o Reimbursed if we do not receive grant (We will resubmit to July 15th, 2020 if needed to cross finish line)
 - With your paid commitment, South Park Telephone waives installation fees You can make one payments of \$250 now and second payment of \$250 when grant is approved
 - Execution of a 3- or 5-year agreement with South Park Telephone is required
- Rates for South Park Telephone's packages are attached. They range from \$89.95-\$119.95 (for a 3-year agreement). This does NOT include the router. You can use your own router or lease one for an additional fee.

Additional thoughts to share....

- While \$500 may seem like a big chunk of change, it's an investment for really GREAT technology. My two
 cents...... I personally expected this commitment fee to be much higher for what we are getting. I truly believe this is
 an "investment" in our futures. Many forms of communication, business & entertainment are heavily reliant on
 internet.
- South Park Telephone was approved for the Silverheels neighborhood in Fairplay.
- The package rates are reasonable and competitive with current Fiber providers. Keep in mind, if your internet bill is lower now, you are paying for service that can lag or slow down often.
- This deadline was January 15th. If needed we will resubmit July 15th to get across the finish line

Broadband Board Grant 60 Day Comment Period

South Park Telephone submitted our application on January 15, 2020. The Broadband Fund invites you to review the applications and provide comments or feedback by March 17, 2020. We encourage all beneficiaries (residents and businesses) of the grant to post comments (link below) to support the project, even though they may have submitted a letter of support.

Community Wildfire Protection Plan

The contractor continues to make good progress updating our Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP) for Platte Canyon. The plan will include: Initial and future analysis, Evacuation protocols, Shelter in Place and Safety Zones, Ember Cast Analysis, and Vehicle Evacuation Modelling.

Mitigation Reimbursement

Burland Firewise continues the mitigation reimbursement program. Annually BHOA members may be reimbursed up to \$75 per year for defensible space / fuels mitigation. Communities adjacent to Burland Ranchettes are eligible to join as associate members (\$20) and receive the benefit of the mitigation reimbursement program. This Return on Investment (ROI) is 375% for you.

Burland Firewise

The Burland Firewise is looking for additional committee members. We have lost three members this winter to competing family and work priorities. Our goal is to have a representative for each of Burland Ranchettes eight districts and adjacent community's. We need your help as we plan for future Saws & Slaws, Chip Day and Community Educational Events. We meet once per month, the second Wednesday of each month, from 6:30 – 8:30 pm. Come help us, to help our Burland Ranchettes neighbors.

Director Openings

We have openings for two Board Directors. The Burland By-Laws state that the Board will appoint new directors when a vacancy occurs. If you recommend someone or you yourself are interested, tell us. There are two requirements:

- 1) You must be a member for 30 days join no later than Feb 15th
- 2) Your deed must say Burland Ranchettes

The board plans to appoint new directors at our March 14th. Our next meeting is this Saturday on February 8th at The Shepherd of the Rockies Lutheran Church at 9:00 a.m.
